RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve Advanced Placement as an alternative program in Elk Island Public Schools and provide a yearly allocation of \$30,725 to cover the associated costs for operating the program.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, Advanced Placement (AP) is being offered at Bev Facey Community High. AP is an internationally recognized and academically rigorous program that introduces students to the beginnings of university level material in a supportive setting. Students have the ability and flexibility to choose one AP course or a full AP timetable. There is a school expectation that students register for a minimum of one AP exam when engaging in the AP program.

Similarly, since 1985 to the current school year, the International Baccalaureate alternative program has been operational at Salisbury Composite High School. The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program provides a challenging, internationally focused, broad and balanced educational experience for students aged 16 to 19. The program is designed to equip students with the basic academic skills needed for university study, further education in their chosen profession as well as developing the values and life skills needed to live a fulfilled and purposeful life. Due to the fact that the IB program has been approved as an alternative program by the Board of Trustees, it receives an additional allocation of \$42,385 to cover the associated costs to run the program.

If the Board of Trustees approves the recommendation, that Advanced Placement become an alternative program within the Division, the school would receive an additional yearly allocation of \$30,725 to cover the associated costs to run the program.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the use of Capital Reserves of \$654,499 for Facility Services vehicle purchases and for wireless improvements. (Attachment 1, Column G).

That the Board of Trustees approve the use of \$104,000 from unspent deferred capital contributions (UDCC) for wireless improvements.

That the Board of Trustees approve the key budget assumptions for 2020-21.

BACKGROUND:

Board Policy 2: Role of the Board, 8.1 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees approve the budget assumptions.

EIPS establishes assumptions that are the building blocks of the budget. Changes in key assumptions such as reserve usage, enrolment and standard cost have the potential to significantly affect the budget.

The provincial government introduced Bill 5 which results in school divisions requiring ministerial approval to access operating reserves. This includes school generated funds (SGF), all reserves at schools and departments (including student transportation) and division allocated and unallocated reserves. It will be very important to ensure EIPS budgets the correct amount of reserve usage for schools and departments.



COVID-19 has had a major impact on the Division. We will assess the impact to the best of our abilities before the budget is completed in May.

The first major assumption, at this time, is that EIPS' true operations will align with those in the 2019-20 fall budget. In early March, schools and departments prepared their forecasts using February actuals. These projections showed no areas of concerns. Unfortunately, these projections are no longer valid as the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in schools being closed effective March 15. As a result, there are no projected reserve balances for schools and departments, other than School Generated Funds, as of August 2020 (Attachment 1, Column E in Operating Reserves).

Since the time projections were completed, the provincial government requested funding of \$2.36 million be returned from Base Instruction and \$1.25 million from Student Transportation. Student Transportation will work to cover the \$1.25 million and the remaining \$2.36 million will be covered through some temporary layoffs and savings from other areas.

There will still be many impacts of COVID-19 that are not yet measurable as of the time of writing this report:

- Will summer school or off-campus education for work experience and Registered Apprentice Program (RAP) operate this summer?
- Will Continuing Education Non-Credit operate any further this year?
- How much CEU funding will be lost to non-HSR schools as the 15 unallocated credits are not funded?
- Has there been any money lost on field trips cancelled (non-refundable deposits)?
- Will there be delays in receiving goods due to COVID-19?
- How much savings will we realize from having the schools closed?

There will be savings in schools for substitute teachers that are no longer needed. A large portion of these savings will be pulled back from schools to cover some of the potential costs outlined above. Any additional savings above 1% carryforward in schools and departments will also offset these unforeseen costs.

Administration will determine the financial impact on the Division to the best of its ability before budget completion for as many of the items listed above as possible.

As a starting point, schools will be asked to complete their budgets without any carryforward surplus. Departments will be allowed to enter up to 1% of their surplus carryforward when they complete their budgets. That is why you see the estimated reserve balances for schools and departments to be zero today (Attachment 1, Column E).

This will change when the Board sees the budget in May. Due to Bill 5 and the restriction on use of operating reserves:

EIPS will estimate (on a consolidated basis) 1% of reserve carryforward for schools. Schools will only
receive the surplus they truly ended with (up to 1%) but we will estimate 1% for all.



- Departments will enter their surplus when they complete their budgets in May up to 1% and they will be held to that 1% carryforward. (If the actual surplus comes in above the 1%, they will only get 1% and if the actual surplus is below the estimate they will get the actual amount).
- EIPS will estimate 50% of the School Generated Fund (SGF) reserve to be used to ensure schools have the flexibility to draw down their SGF beyond their opening balance (\$819,695 Attachment 1, Column F).

This will allow schools and departments to be able to use up to 1% of their reserve carryforward in the fall (if they have one).

Division Allocated Operating Reserve (Attachment 2)

Attachment 2 identifies the proposed changes for 2019-20 and 2020-21. Estimates have also been completed for 2021-22 and 2022-23 to outline estimated future needs. Alberta Education typically requires a projection of the use of Accumulated Surplus and Reserves for the subsequent two years as part of the budget report submitted to them. Each year, administration will bring to the Board for approval the use of Division reserves.

2019-20

- 1. In June of 2020, administration will bring a report to request a transfer from Election Reserve: \$90,486 to accrue for the election to be held in the fall of 2021, and also to request an additional \$9,514 from Division Unallocated Reserves to fund the election for \$100,000 (as long as this does not put us over our 3.6% Board System and Administration (BSA) limit)
 - As discussed with the Board, we want to "smooth" BSA expenditures this is common practice with other school divisions to accrue this as time goes by.
 - Total budget for 2017 election was \$195,000 (\$5,000 in 2016-17, \$190,000 in 2017-18).
 - The actual 2017 election cost was \$154,566 (there were no election costs from the City of Fort Saskatchewan or Lamont County).
 - To be prudent, \$200,000 is estimated for the next election and roughly one quarter should be allocated to this liability annually.

2020-21

- 1. We are estimating half of the SGF **(\$819,695)** will be spent in 2020-21, and we typically do not do this. Our reasoning is that we do not want schools to be restricted by Bill 5 if they need to spend down their SGF next year (Column F, Row N).
- 2. The ERP project will not be complete by year-end. This project is on budget. There will be some additional work to get forms completed, address training and implementation issues and build integrations with other systems. The remaining amounts will need to be spent in 2020-21 (\$335,392) (Column F, Row O).



Division Unallocated Operating Reserve (Attachment 2)

The Division Unallocated Operating Reserve is to cover potential emergent issues and price fluctuations, and to stabilize funding in future years. Prior to 2019-20, the Board maintained the Division Unallocated Reserve at a minimum of 2% of EIPS budgeted operating expenses or approximately \$4.0 million, but due to the reduction in Alberta Education funding in 2019-20, the Unallocated Reserve has been reduced to \$2.93 million or 1.3% of budgeted expenses (using 2019-20 expenses) as of Aug. 31, 2020. If 2020-21 budgeted expenses are used, this is 1.35% of budgeted expenses. (Attachment 2).

A capital effect has been included in the projections as capital assets purchased in the current year are offset by amortization from prior year purchases creating a surplus in the reserve. This year, the capital effect has been split into two components – the assets being purchased from operating budgets and the annual amortization.

As the balance in the Division Unallocated Reserves is below the 2% target, the Division Unallocated Reserves will not be used to balance the budget in 2020-21.

Capital Reserves (Attachment 1)

Capital Reserves can be used for the purchase of future capital assets and can be accessed with Board approval. Every year, capital items are purchased from the operating budget in schools and departments (\$100,000 to \$500,000 per year). These items could be designated to be paid from capital reserves in any given year by the Board. To access capital reserves for operating expenses, the Division would have to obtain permission from the Minister.

- 1. Facility Services: \$114,378 is to be used for Facility Services vehicle purchases for 2020-21.
- 2. EIPS Division Allocated Capital Reserve Projects:
 - Aging Equipment at Schools: \$197,957 to be transferred to complete the wireless improvements.
 Administration feels that most of the aged equipment at schools has been addressed, and that going forward schools need to look at putting dollars aside in their own budgets to cover these costs.
 - The wireless plan in schools has not kept pace with the growing demands and todays "device rich" classrooms. This has led to access dropouts, slowness and general connectivity issues. Additionally, many of the wireless access points are at their end-of-life. These issues negatively impact the learning environment. With the pending release of online curriculum resources, capacity issues will be further impacted. Wireless is a critical service that is necessary to support the bulk of EIPS devices (approximately 10,000 wireless iPads/iPhones, Chromebooks, PC Laptops etc.). The return on investment of these devices is severely impacted if wireless infrastructure cannot adequately support them. As such, the plan is to remediate wireless issues throughout schools and central services.



- Wireless Improvements:
 - Originally, the total cost of \$512,000 was to be spent over three years starting in 2018-19 at \$170,666 per year. The spending in 2019-20 did not occur due to cutbacks in the budget.
 - The original cost estimate of \$512,000 was too low and costs are now estimated to be \$777,353
 (170,666 + 606,687) . Costs have increased and additional funding is needed.
 - Administration is requesting:
 - \$540,121 from capital reserves for wireless improvements
 - \$104,000 from the unspent deferred capital contributions (UDCC) for wireless improvements

This is slightly more than is required (\$604,000) but at the time of writing this report, it is anticipated that costs will increase again.

- Administration is asking to access the unspent deferred capital contributions (UDCC) in the amount of \$104,000 to purchase additional IT wireless improvements. As the Board will recall, this amount came from proceeds on the sale of the Lamont property. Normally, proceeds on these sales go into the capital reserve, but due to the nature of how this was funded it had to be put into the UDCC account.
- 3. EIPS is still anticipating a land purchase in the 2019-20 school year. If this does not occur, it will likely occur in 2020-21. Under Bill 5, capital reserves are not frozen by the province. Administration will bring a report to the Board for approval of this land purchase once a formal agreement is reached.
- 4. Division Unallocated Capital Reserve The estimated available balance at Aug. 31, 2020 is \$103,458.
- 5. If there are additional funds at the end of 2019-20 in the Division Unallocated Reserves, administration will request additional dollars be moved into the capital reserve to allow for the purchase of potential capital items in the future. This request would come to the Board in the fall of 2020 as a report.

Assumptions

This budget has been developed with the following assumptions:

1. Funding:

- That there will not be major changes to Alberta Education's *Interim Funding Manual* released on Feb. 27, 2020 with the provincial operating budget. There were a number of significant changes to the funding manual (the following is not an inclusive list):
 - There are a number of new grants as well as the discontinuation of others; there is no way to crossmatch the grants to determine how funds flow to school boards. The methodology for funding school boards has changed significantly. As an example, in prior years ECS, elementary and junior



- high students were allocated different base grant amounts; this year grades K-9 will receive the same base funding and high school students will be funded at 110% of the base funding rate.
- The method for calculating enrolment is another change. Enrolment is factored into a majority of the new grants. In previous years, projected enrolment was submitted with the spring budget and updated based on enrolment as of September 30 and submitted with the fall budget to Alberta Education. The methodology being used by Alberta Education now is a formula called Weighted Moving Average (WMA), which consists of 2018-19 actual enrolment (20%), plus 2019-20 estimated enrolment (30%), plus 2020-21 projected enrolment (50%). This will have an impact on school boards experiencing large growth and therefore funding. Should the projected enrolment for 2020-21 be overstated, Alberta Education will claw back the associated excess funding in full in the following year. Although EIPS' projected growth is minimal, it will not be fully funded.
- The following updates have been taken into account:
 - On March 26, the government sent out changes to the interim funding manual. These changes have been incorporated and the final funding letter will be sent to school boards on April 15.
 - School boards had until March 27 to submit adjustments to some enrolment numbers and building changes which they had provided in January. The adjustments were made to the budgeted revenue numbers already. We await confirmation that our calculations were done correctly on April 15.
 - School boards had until April 6 to submit further building changes. These will also be incorporated into the April 15 funding envelope primarily in the operations and maintenance calculation. The impact of these changes has been estimated to be minimal to the Division, but we await confirmation on April 15.

Update as of April 17 – The final funding letter has not been received from Alberta Education. Should the final funding envelope be either confirmed substantially late (end of April) and/or be different in anticipated value, we may need to redo the allocations for schools and departments. Schools and departments will be working on their budgets between April 24 and May 5.

- A related assumption is that funding under the new funding model will be received in full, i.e. not reduced
 due to the government's recent response to the COVID-19 pandemic. It was unknown at the time this
 report was written whether the reductions announced on March 28 will continue into the 2020-21 school
 year. Should the 2020-21 funding to the Division be reduced between now and the announcement of any
 future reductions, adjustments will be made at that time.
- Lease funding from Alberta Education for Strathcona Christian Secondary and Strathcona Christian Elementary has been included in the budget. Alberta Education (Capital Planning Department) will be able to confirm in June if the \$651,746 of lease support will be provided.
- Funding for both the Alberta Health Services (AHS) grant of \$292,973 for speech language pathologists and Mental Health Capacity Building (MHCB) grant of \$225,061 will remain for 2020-21. Administration has not received confirmation that these grants will continue. In a normal year this would not be a concern, however, given the fiscal restraints placed on these organizations in Budget 2020 we could see these grants pulled.



- The contract for VOIP (phone lines) services expires this year. Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, Information Technology department is in negotiations to extend the contract for one year. It is assumed they will be successful as the contractor will be busy with other telecom pressures, so the current expense has been continued into 2020-21.
- In 2019-20, EIPS experienced a tremendous liability insurance premium increase of 271%. EIPS' current insurance partner/provider ASBIE will be providing an indication of premium increases on May 12, 2020. A number of school boards are exploring alternate arrangements, and initially, increases ranging from five to 40% over 2019-20 rates have been suggested. To be conservative, the budget has been built with a 40% overall increase to all insurance premiums for 2020-21.
- Operations for Continuing Education Non-Credit and Home Education have been discontinued. We have
 very few home education students. Continuing Education --Non-Credit is not our core work and brought
 very little profit to the Division.
- Carbon tax costs will continue to be factored into the budget. The federal rate is to increase from \$30/tonne to \$40/tonne effective April 1, 2021 and to \$50/tonne April 1, 2022. On Feb. 24, 2020, the Alberta Court of Appeal found the Federal Carbon Tax unconstitutional and is going back to the Supreme Court of Canada. There is no way to predict if and when, during the upcoming fiscal year, the federal government would have to remove the Carbon Tax from Albertans, should the Alberta government succeed.
- Fee collection rates next year will be similar to this year.
- The Minister will approve 100% of our reserve expenditure requests for 2020-21.
- The Program Unit Funding students will be able to be assessed by the deadlines imposed by Alberta Education.

2. Enrolment (Attachment 3)

Enrolment has been finalized.

Under the *Interim Funding Manual*, the majority of funding (50%) is based on the number of students enrolled, so it is important that enrolment projections are developed carefully. An over-estimate would result in a risk to EIPS as the funding received in the current year will be clawed back in the subsequent year, in full. Underestimating the enrolment numbers would result in reduced funding that would not be collected until the following year.

For 2020-21, we continued to perfect our enrolment estimation process developed two years ago. With three years of experience utilizing this estimation process, we are more confident in the numbers provided to Alberta Education. Enrolment was determined primarily by using data from the new student and returning student registration process. The projections from Baragars were also used and enrolment will still fluctuate between now and Sept. 30, 2020, however, the impact to funding will lag a year.



Similar to 2019-20 where enrolment was projected in the spring and actual fall enrolment numbers were different, the same considerations will be made in 2020-21. Where there has been an overestimate of enrolment, there will be a claw back. School budget's will be increased if a school experiences significant enrolment increases thereby necessitating the hiring of an additional teacher.

Enrolment of 17,110 (excluding the Next Step schools) has been determined. This also includes an estimate of pre-kindergarten students; however, staffing will not be completed for those students until they are confirmed.

Over the past six years the enrolment has been as follows (excluding Next Step schools).

Enrolment for Outreach will be consistent with 2019-20 levels at 353 students. With the closure of schools in response to COVID-19, there is the potential for the number of returning grade 12 students to increase.

With the Alberta economy collapsing more than other provinces, there is also the risk enrolment could decrease as families migrate out of the province.

Total enrolment is 17,470. EIPS is anticipating enrolment growth of 70 students.

3. Compensation

There was no economic increase projected (all staff salaries have a 0% increase). Inflationary salary costs (grid movement and benefit costs) continue. We have assumed no increase in base funding rates given the Finance Minister's explicit statement that there is no money available for salary increases

"... in Budget 2020 there's no provision for increased remuneration levels across the board...".

The use of standard costs for certificated and classified staff at the schools ensures staffing decisions are based on hiring the best person as opposed to the actual cost of individuals. It also provides timely reporting to aid monitoring and projections at the schools, as costs are charged over ten months instead of tied to how individuals are paid.

The goal is to develop a standard cost for use by schools and ensure it is as close to actual as possible. A standard cost set too high will create a surplus that should have been spent on current year students. A



standard cost set too low will create a deficit that must be paid from funds designated for students in future years. Neither situation is ideal but the risk to the Division is greater if a deficit is created.

Standard Costs - Schools

- Previously, EIPS calculated certificated standard costs by reviewing the actual certificated staff by experience and education on a monthly basis over the past three years. However, due to the tightened fiscal environment the Division is now facing, a methodology that was more reflective of staff demographics was necessary. Rather than looking at past experience, certificated staffing was examined in detail to determine the actual staff assignments expected for 2020-21 and from this expected staffing list, actual salary costs were calculated based on each individuals' placement on the grid with adjustment for any salary increments expected to be earned during 2020-21. This methodology allowed for a more accurate calculation and should reduce the Division's risk to a large surplus or deficit.
- Certificated standard costs are impacted by retirements (and their replacements), maternity leaves (and their replacements), sick leaves, full-time to part-time changes, grid movement (including its timing), economic adjustments (none this year), and benefit changes.
- o In the 2019-20 calculation, no growth in FTE was assumed. For 2020-21, FTE reductions have been factored into the calculation.
 - The reduction of probationary and temporary teaching positions increases overall standard cost because our staffing mix has a greater number of more experienced teachers than there would have been in prior years.

Classified standard costs were calculated in the same conservative manner as last year

- The weighted average hourly salary for permanent educational assistants (EAs) and hourly EAs were separately calculated. EAs are our largest classified group and permanent EAs have a significantly higher salary and benefit cost than do hourly EAs. By keeping the permanent and hourly EA salary calculations separate, we reduce the risk of a standard cost deficit should the ratio of permanent EAs to hourly EAs increase.
- o For paygrades with less than five employees, the highest pay rate was applied to the entire paygrade.
- The following factors were considered: increments (grid movement) were projected to Aug. 31, 2020 and for 2020-21, economic adjustments (none this year), vacation costs, and benefit rate changes.

Standard Cost – Benefits

- Benefit changes to both certificated and classified staff were also considered.
 - ASEBP has indicated that premium rates for 2020-21 will increase 4.7%.
 - The Experience Adjustment for Life Insurance, Accidental Death & Dismemberment, and Extended Disability is a 10% discount (2019-20 – 15% discount).
 - Pension contribution rates for 2020 for classified staff will remain at 2019 rates as no increase has been approved; no change in rates is projected for 2021.



Board supported benefit premiums for Life/AD&D, Extended Disability, Extended Health Care,
 Dental and Vision are 100% for both certificated and classified staff.

Certificated standard cost will increase by 4% to \$105,170. This increase is due to reductions in FTE, an increased percentage of staff at higher levels on the pay grid, along with increased benefit costs. In addition, \$700/FTE of this increase is because the standard cost set in the prior year during spring budget was \$600,000 lower than expected when projections were updated in the fall.

The classified standard cost changes range from an increase of 4.2% to a decrease of 1.8% due to grid movement and changes in benefit costs. EA salary rates remained almost the same as last year.

Should the certificated staffing decreases be greater than anticipated, or if there are composition changes in any area, standard cost will need to be revisited. Once allocations to schools are finalized, we will need to revisit standard cost.

4. Inflation

There are inflationary non-salary costs that are expected to increase. The overall consumer price index (CPI) for the province has increased 2.5% from February 2019 to February 2020. While the CPI is not reflective of all costs a school board would incur, there are many similarities such as furnishings, equipment, food for courses, reading materials, etc. These inflationary costs will be covered by schools and departments.

5. Board System and Administration (BSA)

The province has changed how expenses for BSA is accounted for. Previously, Alberta Education mandated that costs were to be below 3.6% of total expenditures. For 2020-21 there is now a targeted grant of \$6,297,000 (3.15% of 2018-19 expenditures). In an attempt for consistency across the province, Alberta Education has provided a list of prescribed uses based on a set of definitions. EIPS has reviewed the prescribed list and is confident it will be below the grant amount. Any unused portions can be used towards other Board expenditures such as instruction.

6. Reserves

Reserve estimates currently do not include projections from schools or departments. Due to the province's announcement on March 28, 2020 regarding the reduction of 14% to 2019-20 Base Instruction Grant for May and June, the projections of departments and schools are still changing.



The 2020-21 budget will include:

- Estimated reserve spending by schools (at 1%) and departments up to 1%;
- Use of the Allocated Division Operating Reserve (Attachment 2 Columns F, Row O);
- Increase to the Unallocated Division Operating Reserve (Attachment 2 Column G, Row P); and
- Use of capital reserves (Attachment 1).

7. <u>Department Estimates</u>

The draft budget presented to the Board on May 25, 2020 will include a list of major assumptions and estimates used by departments to prepare budgets.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved, the budget assumptions will be incorporated into the 2020-21 budget. Leadership will be asked to submit balanced budgets which will be consolidated into the Division budget.

EIPS OUTCOME: Student learning is supported through the use of effective planning, managing

and investment in Division infrastructure.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the allocations for the 2020-21 budget.

BACKGROUND:

Board Policy 2: Role of the Board, section 8.2 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees approve the budget allocation of resources.

EIPS establishes assumptions and allocations that are the building blocks of the 2020-21 budget.

The proposed allocation of funds allows schools and departments to maintain essential services and supports the mission, values and Division priorities.

New for 2020-21, the provincial government introduced Bill 5 which results in school divisions requiring ministerial approval to access all of its operating reserves. This includes school generated funds (SGF), all reserves at schools and departments (including student transportation) and the Division Allocated and Unallocated Reserves. It will be very important to ensure we budget the correct amount of reserve usage for schools and departments.



Accumulated Surplus (pg. 1)

As per the Key Budget Assumptions, the budget allocations include the use of Operating Reserves.

Accumulated surplus is projected to be \$10.49 million at Aug. 31, 2021 comprised of:

- \$4.33 million in operating reserves (pg. 2):
 - Schools and Central Services operating reserves are projected to be \$0.82 million;
 - Division Allocated Operating reserve is projected to be \$0;
 - Division Unallocated Operating reserve is projected to be \$3.51 million (1.83%);
 - Minimum level is 2.0% of budget (approximately \$4.0 million).
- \$0.10 million in capital reserves.
- \$6.06 million in Investment in Tangible Capital Assets.

Reserves for Operating Expenditures (pg. 2)

- Operating Reserves Central Services & Schools is being accessed for \$0.82 million.
- Division Allocated Reserve is being accessed for \$0.34 million for Division projects.
- Division Unallocated Reserve is not being accessed to fund any shortfall as the balance is below the 2% target and includes two years of projections.

Revenue and Reserve Summary (pgs. 3 & 4)

Revenue has been adjusted for:

- Alberta Education excluding small grant amounts in the 'other' category (pg. 4)
- Other Government of Alberta
- Other Sales and Services
- Investment Income
- Gifts and Donations

Fees will be updated during the budget process.

Allocations Summary (pg. 9)

Not being able to draw upon operating reserves means that EIPS cannot continue to do everything in the same way or deliver the same level of service as in previous years. In order to deal with the funding shortfall of \$7.52 million (pg. 9) significant reductions were required:

- Schools' allocations were reduced by \$3.95 million (2.9%). Schools will also face an increase in Certificated Standard Cost of 4%.
- Supports for Students-Schools was restructured reducing their budget by \$1.81 million (34.4%)
- Central departments' allocations were reduced by \$3.39 million (combined 16.3%)
- Facilities and Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal increases were offset by reduction to Capital and Debt Services/Teacher Pensions for a net increase of \$1.28 million.
- Student Transportation had a slight increase of \$0.34 million (3.1%) due to increased grant funding.



Schools and departments will be expected to budget and operate within the funding allocations they receive. As a contingency, \$0.78 million has been withheld from allocations for unforeseen changes in the budget. These dollars will be allocated in the fall (pg. 10).

New Allocations

Senior administration met with principals and directors in January and February in a consultative process to seek ideas of how to deal with pending funding reductions. It was heard that it is important to continue to support our most vulnerable students. Supports for Students (SFS) worked to stay within the PUF grant through program changes and staff reductions.

Due to reductions in the Program Unit Funding (PUF) for Play and Learn at School (PALS) and the elimination of PUF for Kindergarten students, increased funding from the Specialized Learning and Support grant is being allocated to support ECS programming. In addition, block allocations were increased to support continued programming for kindergarten students with special needs. The students at Level 3 and Level 4 received support dollars consistent with last year to assist with classroom teachers. As class sizes get larger teachers will need these supports. There will be three new specialized education programs added in 2020-21. There is no longer funding support for Level 1 and Level 2 students.



The provincial funding support for Regional Collaborative Service Delivery (RCSD) has been discontinued for 2020-21. As a result, the RCSD supports for EIPS have now been incorporated into the Specialized Supports – Schools' budget. SFS also increased the amount of allocations out to the schools for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit programing.

Administration initially used *Barager Systems*, a custom planning software for school districts, to examine class sizes, classroom splits, teacher planning time, etc. to allocate funding out to schools. However, it was found to be too prescriptive for this year and with some additional planning work the Division may make the change over to this method next year.

Allocations to high schools account for 25% of the total allocation pool, kindergarten to grade 9 received 72% with the remaining 3% going to rural schools. The Province has changed the funding methodology for rural schools from providing a Small School by Necessity Grant to providing funding based on the enrolment of the school. This changed how EIPS funded rural schools and its important that they stay within the rural funding envelope.

All schools will have to make reductions as a result of the decreased allocation rate per student:

Operations for Continuing Education – Non-Credit and Home Education have been discontinued. We have very few home education students. Continuing Education --Non-Credit is not our core work and brought very little profit to the Division.

Another change from 2019-20 is that the allocation for Advanced Placement is now included at Bev Facey High School.

The Operating and Maintenance grant under the new funding framework is now targeted and is being fully allocated to the Facility Services. As a result of projected insurance increases of 40%, which necessitated additional block funding, it is anticipated that the full grant will be used in 2020-21.

Budget Submissions – Schools & Departments

Our first major assumption, at this time, is that EIPS' true operations will align with those in the 2019-20 fall budget. In early March, schools and departments prepared their forecasts using February actuals. These projections showed no areas of concerns. Unfortunately, these projections are no longer valid, as the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in schools being closed effective March 15. That is why you will see on the top of page 2 in Operating Reserves at the end of August 2020, that there are no projected reserve balances for schools and departments other than SGF.

As a starting point, schools will be asked to complete their budgets without any carryforward surplus. Departments will be allowed to enter up to 1% of their surplus carryforward when they complete their budgets. That is why you see the estimated reserve balances for schools and departments to be zero today on page 2.

This will change when the Board sees the budget in May. Due to Bill 5 and the restriction on use of operating reserves:

- EIPS will estimate (on a consolidated basis) 1% of reserves carryforward for schools. Schools will only receive the surplus they truly ended with (up to 1%) but we will estimate 1% for all.
- Departments will enter their surplus when they complete their budgets in May up to 1% and they will be held to that 1% carryforward. (If the actual surplus comes in above the 1%, they will only get 1% and if the actual surplus is below their estimate, they will only get the actual amount).
- EIPS will estimate 50% of the SGF reserve to be used to ensure schools have the flexibility to draw down their SGF beyond their opening balance.

This will allow schools and departments to be able to use up to 1% of their reserve carryforward in the fall (if they have one). As no funding for cost of living increases have been received by the province, departments will have to find savings within their existing block allocations to offset grid movement within their salary and benefit lines.

We will continue to look to ways to be efficient with these allocations.



Update as of April 17 – The allocations to schools and departments were calculated based on the new grants and their rates as prescribed in the *Interim Funding Manual* released on Feb. 27, 2020, the new Weighted Moving Average formula for enrolment, as well as other items described in this report. The final funding envelope was to be received on April 15.

The final funding letter has not been received from Alberta Education. Should the final funding envelope be either confirmed substantially late (end of April) and/or be different in anticipated value, we may need to redo the allocations for schools and departments. Schools and departments will be working on their budgets between April 24 and May 5.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved, the budget allocations will be incorporated into the 2020-21 budget, which will be presented to the Board on May 25, 2020 for feedback.





Revenue & Reserve Notes

A. Other Government of Alberta

\$460K decrease (8.0%)

Alberta Infrastructure supported amortization is decreasing due to significant assets completing their final year of amortization. The biggest contributors are the furniture and equipment purchase from 2015-16 for Fultonvale Elementary Junior High of \$101K, Fort Saskatchewan High from modernization of \$35K from 1995 and the Bev Facey Community High building of \$324K from 1980-81.

B. Fees \$0K change (0.0%)

The fees remain at the 2019-20 budgeted amount. These will be updated once fees are approved by the Board. Fees will have no impact on the allocations.

C. Other Sales and Services

\$286K decrease (9.6%)

Continuing Education Non-Credit is being discontinued in the 2020-21 school year resulting in a decrease of \$266K related to material and registration fees.

D. Investment Income

\$139K decrease (38.7%)

Elk Island Public Schools has less funds available to invest into Guaranteed Investment Certificates and as they mature, they are currently not being reinvested. Lower interest rates and more cash fluctuations are also factoring into this decrease.

E. Reserves

\$6,802K decrease (85.5%)

In the prior year, reserves were accessed to fund operations and balance the budget. For 2020-21, Division Unallocated reserves are not being drawn down. The Division Allocated Reserves will be used to complete the enterprise resource planning project (ERP) and it is estimated 50% of the school generated funds (SGF) will be used in 2020-21.

Alberta Education Revenue Notes

Due to the significant restructuring of Alberta Education's Funding Model for 2020-21 it is difficult to do a line-by-line comparative. Some grants have been eliminated while others introduced. Even if some of the grants have the same or similar names they are not calculated in the same fashion. The revenue is broken into 5 major funding envelopes.

- 1. Base Instruction
- 2. Services and Supports
- 3. Schools
- 4. Community
- 5. Jurisdiction

F. ECS Pre-K Program Unit Funding

\$2,181K decrease (57.7%)

The decrease in Pre-K Program Unit Funding (PUF) is due to reductions to per child funding rates and changes in eligibility requirements and enrolment determination which resulted in a lower number of children eligible for support. In Spring 2020-21, eligible enrolment for Pre-K Program Unit Funding is 147 compared to 167 in Fall 2019-20.

Program Unit Funding for ECS Kindergarten has been removed from the PUF grant and included in the Specialized Learning and Supports grant. There is no direct correlation though.

G. Operations and Maintenance Grant

\$2,807K increase (21.1%)

This grant under the new funding framework is now targeted. The full amount is being allocated to the Facility Services. As a result of projected insurance increases, it is anticipated that the full grant will be used in 2020-21.

H. Transportation

\$642K increase (6.7%)

Funding will be a 5% increase over prior years finalized grant. In fall of 2019-20, the Transportation grant was not finalized, hence an increase of greater than 5%.

I. Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal (IMR)

\$1,080K increase (43.7%)

Infrastructure Maintenance & Renewal (IMR) funding decreased by \$17K, offset by a lower portion of projects being capitalized as compared to Fall budget. Alberta Government regulations require a minimum of thirty percent of IMR funding to be designated to support capital projects. For 2020-21, 30% of IMR funding is estimated to be capitalized, as compared to 68% in 2019-20.

Alberta Education Revenue Notes

Due to school closures maintenance and renewal work is anticipated to be fully completed for 2019-20 resulting in no carry forward.

J. Regional Collaborative Service Delivery (RCSD)

\$1,074K decrease (100.0%)

Although, RCSD operated as a cross-ministry program, all funding was provided by Alberta Education. To achieve the goals of the 2020-21 funding framework, RCSD funding was redirected to school authorities through allocations to the "pool" of dollars received. There was not a separate funding line for this item.

In prior years, the RCSD money provided to EIPS covered the costs of the Eastern Edge RCSD administration, the entire low incidence team for Eastern Edge and the service delivery team for EIPS.

K. Bridge Funding for New Framework

\$5,341K increase (0.0%)

This funding is what was remaining after the 5 envelopes were calculated and Alberta Education allocated it to school divisions in lump sum. These dollars will be reallocated to divisions with growth over the next 2 years. Therefore, for EIPS with fairly stable enrolment, will likely see this cut in half for 2021-22 and be fully depleted by 2022-23.

L. Secondments

\$1,118K decrease (100.0%)

This has been reduced to \$0 for 2020-21, as we are still waiting for confirmation on the number of secondments and the amount to be received. This amount is used to offset the seconded salaries in Human Resources and thus has no impact on allocations.

M. Small Grants

\$111K decrease (100.0%)

The CTS Bridge to Certification, Odyssey Languages Assistant Program and Dual Credit Programming grants will be updated at budget. This has no impact on allocations.

N. Supported Amortization

\$60K increase (17.8%)


This amount is increasing due to the expected capitalization of the 2020-21 IMR.

O. Teacher Pension

School Notes

A. Basic Allocations

\$2,647K decrease (2.3%)

Basic allocations have decreased as a result of decreased provincial base funding as per the new funding model introduced by Alberta Education for the 2020-21 school year.

Comparisons to prior year are not easy to do given schools' allocations were only adjusted in the fall if enrolment decreased and the fixed rate allocation also includes our three small rural schools (Andrew, Bruderheim and Mundare).

Currently \$777K is being held in contingency for future allocation adjustments.

B. Year End Carry Forward

\$2,119K decrease (100.0%)

School operating budget surplus carry forwards and CEU surpluses are currently projected to be zero as a result of government claw backs of 2019-20 funding. This will be adjusted during the budget process.

C. School Generated Funds

\$820K increase (10.9%)

Increase in School Generated Funds results from estimating usage of one half to avoid Bill 5 restrictions.

D. Early Learning (ECS)

\$2,003K decrease (60.3%)

Decrease in targeted allocations due to reduction in Program Unit Funding (PUF) for Play and Learn at School (PALS) and the elimination of PUF for Kindergarten students. This decrease has been partially offset by increased funding from the Specialized Learning and Support grant being allocated to support ECS programming.

Block allocations are increased to support continued programming for Kindergarten students with special needs which used to be covered by the PUF grant.

The programming for PUF for PALS students has changed to stay within its funding. Additional dollars from Specialized Supports was shifted to Early Learning to support Kindergarten students.

E. Regional Collaborative Service Delivery (RCSD)

\$1,015K decrease (100%)

RCSD funding has been removed from the budget based on projected changes to funding priorities. The RCSD supports for EIPS have now been incorporated into Specialized Supports - Schools.

School Notes

F. Specialized Supports - Schools

\$1,225K increase (334%)

Basic allocations are increased due to increased enrolment in Special Education Programs. There will be three new Special Education programs added in 2020-21.

Increase in targeted allocations result from increases in Specialized Learning Support (formerly Inclusive Learning) funding.

Decreases in block allocations relate to specific department reductions required as a result of government funding cutbacks, offset by increases to support necessary activities previously provided through Regional Collaborative Service Delivery.

Dollars remaining are to be allocated from fall 2020 onwards as inclusive and special education students arrive to the Division.

Central Services Notes

A. Capital and Debt Services

\$780K decrease (10.6%)

The decrease of \$780K is related to reduced supported and unsupported amortization costs.

B. Facility Services

\$979K increase (6.0%)

As a result of the Operations and Maintenance grant becoming targeted, Facility Services budget is now funded primarily through targeted allocations in lieu of block allocations. Facility Services budget reflects a net increase of \$979K in 2020-21's budget. \$137K of this increase is resulting from transferring facility rentals from Continuing Education External to Facility Services. The remaining \$842K comes from a combination of insurance premium increases of \$1,296K offset by a one-time allocation for moving modules in the amount of \$215K and approved department reductions of \$239K.

C. Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal

\$1,080K increase (43.7%)

Infrastructure Maintenance & Renewal (IMR) funding decreased by \$17K, offset by a lower portion of projects being capitalized as compared to Fall Budget. Alberta Government regulations require a minimum of thirty percent of IMR funding to be designated to support capital projects. For 2020-21, 30% of IMR funding is estimated to be capitalized, as compared to 68% in 2019-20. Due to school closures, maintenance and renewal work is anticipated to be fully completed for 2019-20 resulting in no carry forward.

D. Supports for Students

\$1,626K decrease (35.3%)

Block allocations have decreased \$937K relating to specific department reductions required as a result of government funding cutbacks.

Decrease in reserves of \$418K is due to a decrease in division and department carry forward.

Change in transfers of \$518K is due to increased allocations to schools to support First Nations, Métis and Inuit projects, offset by the removal of curriculum support allocations.

Central Services Notes

Targeted allocations have increased \$288K due to increased funding received to support First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students.

E. Human Resources

\$1,063K decrease (17.4%)

Block allocations have decreased \$220K relating to specific department reductions required as a result of government funding cutbacks.

Reserve increase is related to continued Enterprise Resource Planning system implementation funded from Division Allocated Reserves.

Supplemental revenue has decreased \$1,118K due to expected reductions in secondments to Alberta Education.

F. Continuing Education External

\$442K decrease (100%)

For 2020-21, Continuing Education External activities will be discontinued.

EIPS PRIORITY: Enhance high quality learning and working environments.

EIPS GOAL: Quality infrastructure for all.

EIPS OUTCOME: Student learning is supported through the use of effective planning, managing

and investment in Division infrastructure.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the Student Transportation Fees for the 2020-21 school year, as presented.

BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.11 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees will approve various administrative fees annually, including the student transportation fees.

Alberta Education provides transportation funding based on the following criteria:

- Students attending their designated school and residing greater than 2.39 km to the school.
- Students attending a non-designated school and residing greater than 2.39 km to both their designated school and the school they are attending.

For the 2020-21 school year transportation funding will be calculated using the 2019-20 grant submission plus 5% rather than on the current method. This method is being used in the interim while the Transportation funding formula is reviewed by the minister's office



Elk Island Pubic Schools (EIPS) Student Transportation provides an enhanced busing service to students that exceeds the mandated service as outlined by Alberta Education. This enhanced service provides provisions for:

- Students attending a non-designated school;
- Students attending a designated school and residing less than 2.4 km from the school; or
- Students requiring transportation to an address other than their home address.

On Feb. 20/20 the Board of Trustees approved the 2020-21 Student Transportation fee structure effective the 2020-21 school year. The new fee structure reflects changes made to the *Alberta Education School Transportation Regulation AR96/2019*, allowing school authorities to charge eligible funded students a fee for transportation service. The approved fee structure is a simplified, two-tiered fee structure distinguished by eligible and ineligible riders. Policy 17: Student Transportation has also been updated to align with the 2020-21 fee structure.

Charging fees acts as a cost recovery method to offset the funding shortfall of the incremental costs of providing transportation services as set forth in Policy 17: Student Transportation. *School Transportation Regulation AR96/2019 Section 7(4)* reads:

"Any surplus from transportation fees charged under subsection (1) or (2) must be used to subsidize the cost of transportation of students referred to in that subsection in the two school years following the school year in which the surplus was collected."

In order to provide a recommendation for the 2020-21 fee schedule the following factors were considered:

- An analysis of the revenue vs. expenditures of the Student Transportation budget both current year and 2020-21 school year;
- An estimate of anticipated ridership for the 2020-21 school year;
- Segmentation of eligible and ineligible riders based on the 2020-21 Fee Structure;
- Optimization of bus routes; and
- Anticipated fee collections rates using the 2019-20 school year data.

When estimating the number of eligible riders that will access busing as given the new fee structure, a fee for eligible students will be applicable. We queried other school divisions that charge an eligible fee as to what their drop-off rate was. Given the responses from school districts, coupled with the potential economic outcome do to the COVID pandemic, we have anticipated that we will have a 15% drop-off rate for eligible riders.

In providing a recommendation for the 2020-21 fee schedule, using the above considerations as factors the following was determined:

A shortfall in funding requires a cost recovery of 1.267 million dollars given a fuel estimate of \$1.20 per litre which is a budget reduction of \$.10/litre from 2019-20 school year. The attached fee schedule proportionately reflects the recovery of the funding shortfall by assessing a per student fee for eligible students at \$100/year or \$.55/day and ineligible at \$325/year or \$1.80/day.



Student Transportation will continue to offer a payment plan for the 2020-21 school year. The threshold for qualification for the payment plan will be adjusted from \$400 to \$300. Fee payments will be split over a six-month period starting in September and ending in February, this is a change from the current period which is five-month period starting in September and ending in January. For the 2019-20 school year, 276 families participated in the payment plan option and waived \$39,735 in fees. Participation in payment plans increased in 2019-20 while fees waived slightly decreased. Given the current economic climate we anticipate a significant rise in both payment plans and fee waivers for the 2020-21 school year and have budgeted accordingly.

To ensure fees are collected in a timely manner to address accurate and efficient routing as well as dissemination of bus schedules and passes, a fee differential was considered when the 2020-21 fee structure was approved. Due to the COVID-19 crisis and future economic uncertainty, we have not pursued this option.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once the fee schedule is approved by the Board of Trustees, the fees for 2020-21 will be updated on EIPS' website and communicated to the leadership group and the appropriate community and parent groups.

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES (Effective for the 2020-21 School Year)

The Board believes that the safe, caring, and efficient transportation of students provides for equitable access to programming.

The Board may provide enhanced transportation services to those students who, according to the School Transportation Regulation, are ineligible for transportation funding.

1. Student transportation eligibility

- 1. Transportation shall be provided, for a fee, to eligible students. A student is eligible for transportation when:
 - 1. the parents/guardians reside 2.4 kilometres or more from the school they have been designated to attend, or have been directed to attend by the Superintendent or designate; and/or
 - 2. the parents/guardians reside 2.4 kilometres or more from the school they have been designated to attend for a French Immersion, bilingual, or special education program.
- 2. The Board may provide transportation for special needs students that reside less than 2.4 kilometres from their designated school where deemed necessary by the Superintendent or designate.
- 3. Temporary eligibility may be granted at the discretion of the Superintendent or designate in new subdivisions until sidewalks or permanent streets are completed.

2. Enhanced student transportation

- 1. Enhanced busing service:
 - 1. may be made available, for a fee, to students who reside less than 2.4 kilometres from and attend their designated school;
 - 2. may be made available, for a fee, to students who attend a school/program other than their designated school;
 - 3. shall be limited to available space on existing school buses, and offered on a first come first serve basis;
 - 4. shall be offered providing there is no significant diversion from regular routing:
 - 5. shall be determined on an annual basis; and
 - 6. requires that parents/guardians pay a fee for service.
- 2. Supplemental busing service
 - 1. may be made available, for a fee, to students who are accessing an additional bus to/from an alternate address providing:
 - 1. there is available space on the bus;
 - 2. there is no significant diversion from regular routing; and
 - 3. parents/guardians have paid a fee for service.

3. Provision of transportation services

- 1. Transportation services shall normally be provided by contract. The Board's representative for the purposes of administration of agreements shall be the Superintendent or designate.
- 2. Where it is feasible and fiscally responsible, the Superintendent or designate may make other busing agreements and inform the Board as such.

4. Transportation fees

- 1. Transportation fees shall be paid prior to accessing busing.
- 2. Payment options shall be made available for transportation fees.
- 3. A waiver process shall be in place for transportation fees to the designated school.
- 4. Student transportation fees shall be reviewed and approved annually by the Board.



BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.11 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees will approve various administrative fees annually including the Facility Services fees.

Leasing of school facilities shall be considered on the basis of functional compatibly, space availability, land use compliance, and financial impact. It is believed that after Division requirements have been met, the community shall have a reasonable access to Division facilities (AP546). Offering surplus space for the provision of before and after school care supports families of EIPS students by having consistent and safe care for their children. Preschool programming provides opportunities for future students to reach social, intellectual and physical development milestones for kindergarten and grade 1 readiness.



Based on the 2018-19 school cost per square meter and the current increase in costs in 2019-20, there is an expected overall increase in operational costs. The increase in costs are a result of ever-increasing insurance premiums as well as the identification of relevant costs that were not previously included in the cost recovery calculation. As a result, EIPS proposes to increase the cost to the Not-for-Profit Registered Societies Surplus Classroom Space Fees to \$5.16/m² to break even. After conducting market research on average commercial leases, EIPS has much lower than average rates. From available data online, average cost/m² is approximately \$17.78 in the Sherwood Park and Fort Saskatchewan region. As such, EIPS is recommending an increase in the fees for for-profit organizations to \$16.50/m². At this rate, EIPS will remain as a below average cost provider of surplus space, which is pertinent to our Community.

Supporting communities (students and their families) to engage in activities to promote healthy lifestyles continues to be a high priority for the Division. The use of gymnasiums and other division space will be offered to the community at rates based on actual cost recovery of costs incurred by the Division. As operational costs have increased, EIPS proposes a 10% increase in rental rates for gymnasiums for youth and adult recreational users for after hour rentals, volleyball equipment rental increase to \$3.50, and a separate rate for classroom rentals on weekends due to recovering additional custodial costs.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Following approval by the Board, the rental rates will be updated on the website and communicated to the leadership group. All after hours facility rental user groups, daycares, and before and after school care groups will then be notified of the approved rate changes via email.

Fees for Alberta Non-residents and International Students are administered for the purpose of recovering education programming costs for students who are not eligible to receive provincial funding.

No increase is proposed for the 2020-21 school year. The rates for 2019-20 were increased by 12%, based on the 2019 Association of School Business Officials of Alberta (ASBOA) School Fees Survey, which showed EIPS' fees to be below the average charged by participating school divisions. Increasing by 12% aligned EIPS near the average of what other Alberta school divisions are charging.

For the 2019-20 school year, one half-year student and two full-year international students are in attendance. There are no Alberta non-resident students registered with EIPS in 2019-20.

Once approved, the tuition schedule will be updated on the EIPS website and communicated to the leadership group, school councils and the appropriate community and parent groups.

BACKGROUND:

With the new *Education Act*, restrictions on school fee increases and the requirement for Ministerial approval were removed from the School Fees Regulation. In January 2020, the Board set parameters for the 2020-21 school fees. The parameters were set to ensure students achieve a quality education, but also to ensure that fees are not cost-prohibitive for parents. Following is the list of parameters to guide principals in for establishing 2020-21 school fees:

Fee Type	Parameter
Optional courses	Cost recovery only. Maintain or decrease from prior year. *
Noon supervision	Cost recovery only. Maintain or decrease from prior year. *
Activity fees (field trips)	Fees can be increased >5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.

Non-curricular travel (overnight ski or band trips)	Fees can be increased >5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.

The economy for Alberta has not strengthened and families are feeling the financial strains more than ever. EIPS is balancing fee increases between providing a high-quality education and operating within the constraints of both our budget and the fiscal realities of our families.

Schools were encouraged to be generic, if possible, when setting fees to allow teachers flexibility when unforeseen circumstances arise. For example, when a field trip is cancelled due to weather, they can replace it with a new field trip at the same cost without the need for additional approval.

EIPS sent the parameters to schools once they were approved by the Board and the process, as described in Attachment 1, was followed to the best of each school's ability. Due to cold weather temperatures in January, parent consultations were delayed until February, and due the COVID-19 public health emergency, some schools were unable to hold the second consultation.

School fees that exceed established parameters are listed in Attachment 2. New courses or programs are listed in Attachment 3. Change in fees per student from 2019-20 to 2020-21 are shown in Attachment 4. The report is organized from highest to \$10 and the remainder of fees were not included. Finally, respective fee schedules for each school are grouped together in Attachment 5.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved by the Board, schools will be notified of the approval and the fees will be posted on each school's website.

Establishing School Fees for 2020-21

Process and timelines

1. Parameters for setting fees (January)

Parameters are important as schools strive to improve/add to the value of education without impact to their budgets. The parameters help guide schools and protect parents. Parameters will be set by the Board in January.

2. Initial parent consultation (January)

Principals will hold an initial consultation with parents prior to setting, increasing, or decreasing fees. Questions and parent responses will assist schools in developing the fee schedule.

- 1) Email/contact all parents at least two weeks prior to the school council meeting to:
 - Indicate that school fees will be discussed (course fees, noon supervision, activity fees, and extra-curricular – including sports);
 - Provide parents with a current fee schedule (by attachment or link to the website);
 - Provide a list of questions for consideration; and
 - Supply a mechanism for obtaining parent feedback for those who are unable to attend the school council meeting.
- 2) Specifically, we will be asking for input on the following:
 - Optional courses and associated fees
 - Noon hour supervision
 - Field trips and associated fees
 - Extracurricular activities
 - Non-curricular travel (for example, ski trips and band camps)
 - Non-curricular goods and services (for example, student union and yearbooks)

3. Fee submission template (February)

Financial Services will provide a template to schools for completing proposed fees for the new school year. Proposed fees will be established by using the parameters approved by the Board, principal discretion, parent feedback, and fee calculation tools.

4. Second parent meeting (March/April)

A second meeting with parents must be held to share proposed fees and the rationale for additions, increases, decreases, etc.

- 1) Email all parents at least two weeks prior to the school council meeting to indicate there will be a review of proposed school fees for 2020-21. The email will include the proposed fees.
- 2) After the meeting, the Principal and School Council Chair will sign a declaration affirming completion of all required steps. A checklist will be included on the declaration form.

- 5. Proposed fee schedules and declarations are due to Financial Services (April)
- 6. Financial Services will prepare school fee schedules for presentation to the Board (April/May)
- 7. The Board will review/approve proposed fees. If possible, timing will be such that they are not presented in the same month the spring budget is presented. (May/June)

8. Course Registration

As registration occurs prior to the approval of fees, the proposed fee schedule, as presented at the second parent council meeting, will accompany registration forms (or course handbooks) as "estimated" fees for the 2020-21 school year and subject to Board approval. Communication must be made by email to all parents with the list of proposed fees.

9. Extra-curricular/Sports teams

Before a student can try out for a team, parents must be made aware of the financial and time obligations for participation. Schools will email parents with students signed up for tryouts, prior to the tryouts, outlining the fee, practice and game schedules, responsibilities of team members, and other relevant information.

10. Fee additions/changes

The Board recognizes that, during the school year, flexibility is needed to make fee additions or changes for missed fees or new opportunities. These will be subject to approval by the Superintendent and Secretary-Treasurer. Two reports will be presented to the Board at Education Committee meetings in January and June with any approved changes.

11. Tracking

Schools are required to individually track costs related to fees for courses, activities/field trips, and other revenue to ensure details on fees and offsetting costs are readily available.

The Board, at the organizational meeting and thereafter at any time as determined by the Board, shall elect one (1) of its members to serve as Board Chair, to hold office at the pleasure of the Board. The Board entrusts to its Chair primary responsibility for providing leadership and guidance.

The Board delegates to the Chair the following powers and duties:

- 1. Preside over all Board meetings and ensure such meetings are conducted in accordance with the *Education Act* and the policies and procedures as established by the Board.
- 2. Prior to each Board meeting, confer with the Vice-Chair, designated trustee, and Superintendent on the items to be included on the agenda, the order of these items, and become thoroughly familiar with them.
- 3. Be familiar with basic meeting procedures (i.e. Roberts Rules of Order).
- 4. Perform the following duties during Board meetings:

BOARD COMMITTEES

The Policy Committee met on April 14, 2020 is recommending the following amendments:

- 1. Strike the fourth paragraph "The Board believes in the establishment and review of policy that reflects its values and perspectives" as a belief statement is not required.
- 2. Under Planning and Evaluation, "in cooperation with the Superintendent" is replaced with "with the support of the Superintendent" to better reflect the Superintendent's role.
- 3. In section 6, remove "and may develop such other procedures" as it a redundant statement.
- 4. In section 7, remove "The Superintendent may choose to then develop an administrative procedure relative to this matter" as the statement is not required in a Board policy.

EIPS GOAL: A focus on wellbeing including student citizenship and staff engagement.

EIPS OUTCOME: Our learning and working environments are welcoming, caring, respectful and

safe.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve new Board Policy 25: Petitions and Public Notices, as presented.

BACKGROUND:

The Board is responsible for developing, approving and monitoring the implementation of policies to guide the Division, and to provide direction in those areas over which the Board wishes to retain authority.

The Policy Committee receives information from trustees/administration/stakeholders and discusses/develops policy positions as directed by the Board.

Pursuant to requirements identified in the *Education Act,* Policy 25: Petitions and Public Notices has been developed for approval.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved, the Board Policies and Administrative Procedures will be updated on the website and StaffConnect, and stakeholders will be advised.

Policy 25

PETITIONS AND PUBLIC NOTICES

Petitions may be used to express public opinion. Petitions are requests to provide support or opposition on a matter. Petitions that meet all requirements can be used to request the Board of Trustees to consider taking action on a specific issue.

1. Definitions

1.1. Elector

is a person who is eligible to vote in an election as defined in section 1 of the *Municipal Government Act* and section 1 of the *Local Authorities Election Act*.

1.2. Petition

is a formal request to the Board of Trustees signed by a number of electors.

1.3. Petitioner

is an elector as defined above and who signs a petition.

1.4. Witness

is an adult person who claims that he or she was personally present and saw the petitioner sign his or her name.

2. Petitions

- 2.1. Each page of the petition must contain:
 - 2.1.1. an identical statement of the purpose of the petition; and
 - 2.1.2. an identical statement on the protection of personal information.
- 2.2. A petition must be signed by at least the lesser of 5,000 electors, and the number of electors that is equal to 10% of the number of funded students of the board, in a division, and include the following for each petitioner:
 - 2.2.1. the printed surname and given names of the petitioner;
 - 2.2.2. the signature of the petitioner;
 - 2.2.3. the street address of the petitioner or legal land description on which the petitioner resides:
 - 2.2.4. the petitioner's telephone number or e-mail address, if any;
 - 2.2.5. the date on which the petitioner signs the petition; and
 - 2.2.6. the signature of an adult witness next to each petitioner's signature.
 - 2.2.6.1. The witness must undertake an affidavit that, to the best of the person's knowledge, the signatures witnessed are those of persons entitled to sign the petition.
 - 2.2.6.2. This requires the witness to determine, at a minimum, that the petitioner:
 - 2.2.6.3. is at least 18 years old; and
 - 2.2.6.4. resides in the jurisdiction of Elk Island Public Schools.
 - 2.2.6.5. The witness must be present and see the person sign the petition document.

- 2.3. No name shall be removed from a petition after it has been received by the Board.
- 2.4. When the petitioners wish to present a petition to the Board, they shall do so by filing the petition with the Secretary-Treasurer.
- 2.5. When a petition is filed with the Secretary-Treasurer, the Secretary-Treasurer shall:
 - 2.5.1. determine the number of petitioners that have signed the petition;
 - 2.5.2. determine whether the petition meets the requirements of section 2.1 and 2.2; and
 - 2.5.3. having made the determination under section 2.5.1 and 2.5.2, declare the results of the Secretary-Treasurer's determination, and provide written notification of the declaration to the petitioners.
- 2.6. If a petition is found under section 2.5 to be insufficient, the Board shall proceed as if the petition had not been presented to the Board.
- 2.7. Where it is determined that a petition is insufficient, the petitioners may appeal the determination as per the legislation.
- 2.8. If a petition is determined sufficient by the Secretary-Treasurer, the Board shall, within 30 days of the date of the written notification declaring the results of the determination made under section 2.5, establish a committee to review the petition.
- 2.9. The committee shall review the purpose of the petition and provide recommendations to the Board in response to the purpose of the petition.
- 2.10. The Secretary-Treasurer shall provide the petitioners with written notification of the outcomes of the review within 90 days of the date of the written notification declaring the results of the determination made under section 2.5.

3. Public Notices

- 3.1. When public notice, including notice of a public meeting, is required to be given under the Education *Act*, the notice must be given:
 - 3.1.1. by publishing the notice at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in at least one newspaper that has general circulation in the area of the Division;
 - 3.1.2. by posting the notice for 10 business days in at least two areas that the Secretary-Treasurer considers appropriate.

Establishing a shared foundation to guide the work, strategic planning and decision making of Elk Island Public Schools is a responsibility of the Board. This is accomplished through the development and ongoing review of the Four-Year Strategic Plan; which is a key document that provides overall direction for the Division.

Prior to the announcement of the 2020-21 Education Budget, the Board felt it was imperative to ensure that the key priorities, goals and outcomes that would be funded, in a fiscally challenging environment, be determined. This was done to assist the Board in its decision making with respect to budget allocations.
