Course Description:

Christian Studies and Living 7-9 presents students with valuable opportunities to cultivate attitudes, skills, and knowledge that will empower them to become engaged, active, well-informed, and responsible disciples of Jesus Christ. Within a thoughtful and meaningful community, recognizing and respecting individual and collective identities is crucial. Christian Studies and Living 7-9 fosters the development of students' sense of self and community, encouraging them to affirm their unique place as individuals within the wider body of Christ.

The primary objective of Christian Studies and Living 7-9 is to provide students with meaningful encounters and the ability to discern biblical, cultural, historical, and contemporary issues from a Christian perspective. By engaging with these subjects, students are equipped to encounter and navigate them while upholding Christian values.

Student Need:

Christian Studies and Living 7-9 offers students a platform to delve into the study of Christianity within an academic context. This course invites students to explore different facets of Christianity, encouraging them to engage as critical thinkers about religion and the development of their own personal faith. Through the learning outcomes of this course, students are empowered to identify and examine key themes within Christianity, as well as in other world religions, and to consider the influence of these themes on decision-making processes for individuals. Ultimately, Christian Studies and Living 7-9 aims to provide students with opportunities to develop a comprehensive understanding and appreciation of how faith plays a role in shaping moral values and guiding ethical decision-making.



Scope and Sequence (Learner Outcomes):

The guiding questions and outcomes in Christian Studies and Living 7-9 are interrelated and interdependent. This model best represents a students' faith journey as students begin to have a broader understanding of the world around them. Student learning outcomes should be reinforced, extended, and broadened with each successive grade level, building on what the students have learned before. The outcomes should be progressive, promoting the development of more intricate thinking skills as students grow and encounter new life experiences. Outcomes can be integrated or re-clustered to best suit the needs and maturity of the students as the year progresses.
